*Demographics

Demographics are a set of averages for a particular population termed a community. These averages consider things such as age, income, education, and lifestyle.

Additional characteristics when analyzing and presenting a geographic area as a population include an accounting for the number of households, and profiling that geographic area's groups of people as well as its *laborforce and **workforce.

*Labor Force

The total number of workers in an area plus the total number of people looking for work; the number of people believed to be available to work. This number includes an estimate or count of all possible applicants for jobs that are available. Hence, this number is the total number of people employed, assumed to be underemployed, and the unemployed.

** Work Force

A projection of the number of people working in an area. Workforce is the labor force minus the number of unemployed.
