REPORT:

- Congratulations to Officer Meghan Robinson who gave birth to a beautiful baby girl on December 21st, 2021. They are both healthy and at home.
- Annual Shop-with-a-Cop event: Similar to last year and being flexible with the pandemic, our officers thought out of the box to try and find a way to make a difference in the lives of others. This year the event focused on Birchwood Care Center and giving to over 60 residents. All of the residents received several gifts each and six residents were adopted individually due to not having visitors. Thank you to those individuals who donated gifts to this cause and Walmart who provided the community grant along with a catered lunch to the residents.
- The police department received its provisional certification with the Ohio Collaborative on two new standards: 1) *Law Enforcement Response to Mass Protests/Demonstrations* and 2) *Agency Wellness*. All law enforcement agencies are expected to meet or exceed these standards as they develop policies and procedures. Agencies review their own compliance, strive to progress, and are required to submit standards of proof, reviews, and reports on an annual basis.
- Officers arrested a male subject after someone witnessed him steal a golf cart from Bridgewater Falls. The subject drove the stolen golf cart into the Lakewood Subdivision where officers located him. He was uncooperative and was charged with Theft (M1) and Obstructing Official Business (M2) and booked into the BC Jail for multiple arrest warrants from several local police agencies.
- 1900-block of Parkamo Avenue – female called in and told dispatchers she had a gun and a male acquaintance gave her dog meth. Officers responded to find the female possibly under the influence of meth and she also admitted to possessing a sawed-off 22 rifle with the serial number defaced. Officers arrested the female for multiple outstanding warrants, including one for child support, and charged her with Possessing a Defaced Firearm and booked her in to the BC Jail.
- Officers investigated a domestic violence complaint in the 3500-block of Crooked Tree – officers arrested a male for domestic violence after he burned his live-in girlfriend/child’s mother with hot water from the stove. He was booked into the BC Jail for the DV charge.

- Paramedics and officers responded to the parking lot along Canal Road near Allison Avenue for a female found face-down. The female was found to be highly intoxicated and uncooperative. Medics transported her for treatment and officers cited her accordingly.
- Officers responded to Walmart for a female shoplifter. During their search incident to arrest they located a bag of white powder on her person which was determined to be heroin.
- Officers responded to the 2700-block of Apex Court for a tip that four missing juveniles were staying in a local residence. The juveniles fled on foot when they saw the officers approach; however, they were successfully tracked down and returned to their guardians.
- Officers responded to Tylersville Road at Morris Road for an occupied school bus that pulled in front of oncoming traffic, resulting in a head-on collision. Fortunately, no injuries were sustained by the bus occupants and only minor injuries to the other driver.
- Officers took multiple terroristic threat reports throughout the month of December. Local juveniles were receiving/reading messages about an active shooter incident taking place. FTPD worked with surrounding agencies and school districts as all were addressing the same types of call.
- Officers responded to Walmart for a male shoplifter. Upon arrival, the suspect resisted arrest and fled on foot. Officers were able to capture him and arrested him for multiple charges in addition to several outstanding felony warrants.
- Officers responded to the area of Walmart for a theft in progress and located the male suspect pushing a stolen barbecue grill on the sidewalk on Princeton Road. Officers found drug abuse instruments and drug paraphernalia on his person and he was charged with several offenses and released.
- Officers responded to the 2500-block of Grand Avenue in reference to a domestic violence incident which occurred in the township. The female victim advised her live-in-boyfriend assaulted her and she fled the area to get away from him. Officers were able to locate the male subject and arrested him for DV.
- Officers responded to the 5800-block of Reigart Road for a reported suspicious incident. The caller said they received a phone call from another person that two people had overdosed in the basement. Officers located a wanted domestic violence suspect from a prior shift's call and arrested him without incident.
- 1900-block of Allstatter Avenue for a burglary report. The victim stated that someone forced entry into his residence while he was gone and stole several items.
