- The department obtained approval from the state to operate the temporary holding facility following the annual inspections and required audit.
- \$7,800.96 received from the Ohio Attorney General to be used to cover some of the costs associated with providing Year 2022 Continuing Professional Training (CPT) as outlined by the state.
- Sgt. VandeRyt and Sgt. Mays attended the Police Executive Leadership College (PELC) annual conference.
- The department held a “Coffee with a Cop” community event at Coffee Cup Overflowing on Winford Ave.
- A male subject who was previously indicted on multiple sex offenses pleaded guilty in court. Those charges include Gross Sexual Imposition, Importuning, Unlawful Sexual Conduct with a Minor, Compelling Prostitution, and Pandering Sexually Oriented Matter Involving a Minor. A future sentencing date is set.
- Several vehicles broken into around the southwest area of Walden Ponds. All of those vehicles were left unlocked overnight.
- Several reports taken at Walmart for stolen purses/wallets which are being left unattended/open for easy access to suspects.
- Several new sex offense crimes reported in February with some of those involving juveniles as the victims.
- An individual showed up at an area hospital with a gunshot wound. Following an investigation and working with Cincinnati PD, the teen victim admitted he accidentally shot himself.
- Officers attempted to locate an aggravated burglary suspect on Red Coat Drive. The subject fled on foot prior to the officers making contact at the residence.
