- Officers Roach, Flynn, Coy, Bartlett, and Reed attended the 5-day CIT training course hosted at Middletown Police Department.
- Capt. Lanier was accepted as a member of the Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police (OACP) Publication Committee and serves as a District 4 member.
- SR4 near Butler Tech traffic stop on a vehicle led to the driver being arrested for driving under the influence and possessing two loaded handguns. The driver was later booked into the BC Jail including felony charges.
- Officers responded to Walmart for a motorist who pointed a firearm at another motorist. The suspect was identified and arrested after officers located a concealed, loaded 9mm Glock handgun under the driver's seat. The driver was booked into the BC Jail for multiple charges including felonies.
- Domestic Violence/protection order violation on Lester Avenue. Victim stated the suspect struck her several times and headbutted her. The suspect was gone and officers located him a couple days later and arrested him on multiple felony charges based on this incident and prior convictions.
- Dollar Tree parking lot two subjects overdosing in a car. After being medically cleared, one of the subjects was arrested for a statewide pickup radius warrant and booked into the BC Jail.
