- May 15th was Peace Officers Memorial Day and Police Week continued through May 21st. We appreciate all of the community support and those who stopped by to recognize and thank our officers for their commitment to service. Thank you!
- On May 26, 2022, evening shift officers responded to a “shots fired” call inside Walmart. The suspect attempted to steal items when others in the store tried to intervene and stop him. The suspect pulled out a handgun and shot two people: an employee was shot in the chest resulting in serious injuries and a customer died as a result of his gunshot wound.
- Officer Dutra completed the 16-hour Field Training Officer course at Butler Tech and received his certificate as a Field Training Officer (FTO).
- Officer Gilbert completed the Supervisor and Training Education Program (STEP), a multi-week course comprised of over 20 modules such as effective listening and speaking, improved written communication, performance management, critical incident management, tabletop exercises, and contemporary issues in law enforcement.
- Sworn personnel completed range qualifications and additional training such as building searches, breaching techniques, and simunition training in the range house.
