May 17, 2023 – The police department, along with other departments and jurisdictions, participated in the Fairfield North Elementary School Vehicle Day. The weather was perfect and everyone had an exceptional time.

On May 11, 2023, officers responded to the 2600-block of Arroyo Ridge for a house fire and an adult female lying in the backyard. The victim had multiple injuries as well as severe burns to her body. Police arrested a 23-year-old male who lives at the house and booked him into the BC Jail for Aggravated Arson and Felonious Assault. The investigation revealed that the victim was in a bedroom when the suspect assaulted her and then set her on fire. The victim got out of the house through a second-story window and into the backyard where a neighbor found her and called for help. The victim remains in critical condition.

7800-block of Morris Road for three loose Longhorn cattle. The caller said the newly purchased cattle jumped over the fence and were now in the woods behind her property. It took many resources and volunteers over the next several days before all three cattle were located and secured.

Officers assisted Hamilton PD after a vehicle fled an armed robbery and later crashed on Hamilton Enterprise Park.

May 20, 2023 – Officers noted that nearby agencies had a high call volume of violent crimes (stabblings, shootings, etc.). Also, numerous pursuits took place that originated in Warren County. Mason PD is currently experiencing a high volume of vehicle thefts that are suspected of being committed by groups of “Juveniles.”

Officers were made aware that HPD was investigating an armed robbery in which the victim’s vehicle was stolen at gunpoint by four males wearing masks. Township officers located the unoccupied stolen vehicle parked near Pater Avenue/Alston Avenue.
