Officers responded to the 6800-block of Paducah for a male with a gunshot wound. Two suspects were arrested and charged with felonious assault and weapon-related offenses. Case pending in court.



There is an increase in sextortion reports where suspects are soliciting nude photos over the internet, and then threaten to send those photos to the victim's friends and family unless the victim pays money.

We continue to encourage everyone to lock their vehicles, secure belongings, and reduce their chance of becoming an unnecessary victim of a theft offense.

Officers responded to the area of Tuley Road and Concord Street for a report of shots fired. A resident reported he heard two shots that were fired from a car driving in the area. A shell casing was recovered from the scene and officers canvassed the area but were unable to locate any damage and there were no other reports.
