The police department implemented the new police reporting software. The software is integrated with the county dispatch CAD system, allows for mobile reporting, and captures more activities compared to the prior outdated RMS system. The vendor provided training to all employees over two and one-half days here at the police station.

Darryl Marcum pleaded guilty to three counts of Illegal Use of a Minor in Nudity Oriented Material. He is set for sentencing in November.

Search warrant served in the 3000-block of Canal Road following an investigation of a male subject (with prior felony convictions) possessing firearms. Officers recovered evidence at the scene and the subject was arrested and charged with Weapons Under Disability and booked into the BC Jail.

A male subject fled from officers during midnight shift when they attempted to pull him over for a hazardous moving violation. A short pursuit ensued, and the officer was able to get the vehicle stopped in Deerfield Estates Mobile Home Park where he arrested the driver. The suspect was charged with multiple traffic violations, driving without a license, and fleeing and eluding.

Midnight shift officers stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation and saw an empty holster in the car. Officers located a handgun in the car near the driver and determined that the driver was not legally able to possess the firearm. He was arrested for firearms related offenses and booked in the BC Jail.

Midnight shift officers located a suspicious vehicle on Parkamo Avenue and located a male and female in the area. Officers observed suspected stolen property and learned the suspects were breaking into cars. Officers arrested the female, and the male took off running. It was later determined that the property the officers recovered belonged to victims here in the township as well as in Hamilton and Fairfield.
