The Public Works Department constructed an area to store the police department waste containers. The containers were previously stored in a rocky area between the cars and the gate and Rumpke could not easily access them during pickup. The new location provides easier access to the containers.

We hosted a one-week, IPMBA-certified Police Mountain Bike Patrol training. Officer Coy served as the instructor and participants were Officer Thompson, Officer Caldwell, BCSO deputies, and Sinclair Community College police officers.

April 27<sup>th</sup> – Drug Take Back Day was a success! We had a record number of 187 lbs. turned in for disposal.

April 26<sup>th</sup> – The Citizen Police Academy class commenced with a graduation and certificate ceremony. The participants provided positive feedback of their experiences, and some intend to continue by participating in the CAPS Program.

Congratulations to Officer Caitlin Fugett who was hired on as our newest police officer. Welcome to the TEAM!

Three sergeants attended the 40-hour Butler County Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training hosted at Monroe PD.

An armed bank robbery occurred at the AurGroup Credit Union. The suspect was quickly identified and arrested at her house. She was booked into the BC Jail and this case is pending in court.

Officers responded to Princeton Road at Satrial Drive for a disabled vehicle causing traffic congestion. Officers discovered the driver was heavily intoxicated and incoherent and a three-year-old child was found unrestrained in the car. The suspect resisted arrest and was booked into the BC Jail for OVI, Child Endangerment, and Resisting Arrest.

Officers responded to Walmart for an emotionally disturbed person (EDP). The subject refused to speak with officers and declined help from medics. The subject exited the ambulance and went to Wendy's where he asked staff to call 911 because the police were trying to kill him. BC Mobile Crisis responded to perform an evaluation and the subject threw a cup of water at Wendy's staff. Officers attempted to detain the subject but he took off running and then resisted arrest and assaulted officers. He was transported to a medical facility for a psychological evaluation.

Officers assisted BURN with a search warrant in the 5900 block of Beaty Lane. One individual was arrested for possession of methamphetamine and a second person was arrested for an outstanding warrant.

Officers conducted a traffic stop on a bicycle near Imlay Avenue and Parrish Avenue. The subject was arrested for an outstanding warrant and officers located "crack" cocaine, a "crack" pipe, and other paraphernalia associated with drug use.

Officers responded to the hospital for a 17-year-old with two gunshot wounds. The involved parties would not cooperate with investigators. The investigation revealed that the shooting may have occurred elsewhere.

Officers responded to Children's Hospital to investigate a possible child abuse case involving an infant. Officers consulted with BC Children Services and determined that the reported injuries may have resulted from a medical condition. This case remains under investigation.
