Firehouse 212 was struck on June 3rd by someone experiencing a medical emergency. There were no injuries in the crash, but the building did suffer damage.

June 2025 was the 39th Anniversary of the Line of Duty Death of William B. Gray Sr. While returning from an auto accident Bill suffered a heart attack and lost control of the fire engine. The engine went of the roadway and into a ravine on Hamilton Mason Rd just West of Morris Rd. The force of the impact threw Darell Murrell into the dash breaking one of his legs. Firefighter Gray who was driving the engine was killed in the accident. We continue to remember and celebrate the contributions Bill made to both our Fire Department as well as the community.
