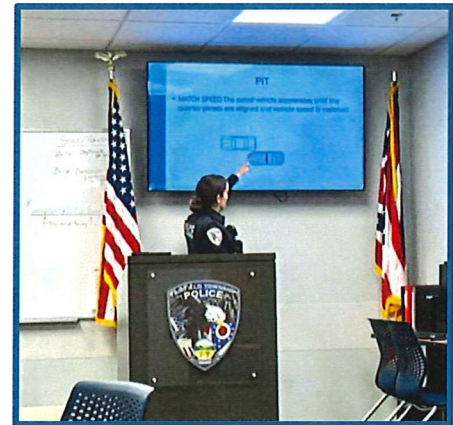

In-Service Training*

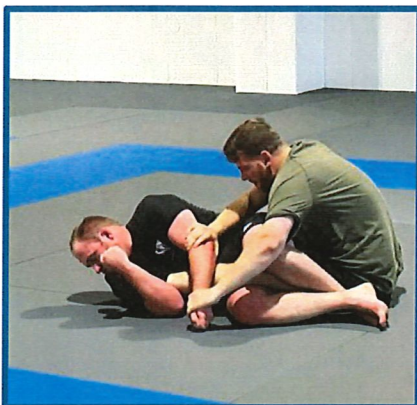
Officer M. Robinson completed in-service training with all sworn personnel on The PIT ("Precision Immobilization Technique") Maneuver.

Sergeant R. Roach provided Police Jiu-Jitsu training for all FTPD sworn personnel. This training curriculum was approved by the state and went toward each officer's required CPT hours for 2023.

Jayfield Drive at Carrington Way for a juvenile who was riding a dirt bike, ran a stop sign, and struck a car in the intersection.

4100-block of Millikin Road for a single-vehicle crash off the roadway. The driver was transported for serious injuries and this case remains under investigation.

Lakewood Drive near Princeton Road for a suspicious male jumping onto the hoods of moving cars. Upon arrival, officers located a male jumping on the hood of a car and blocking traffic. The subject appeared to be under the influence and was arrested and booked into the BC Jail. He also had an outstanding warrant for felony drug possession.

Officers responded to Menard's for a shoplifter who was irate and uncooperative. The subject refused to comply with officers' commands and was subsequently arrested. A search incident to arrest revealed methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia. Additional felony charges are pending.

Sentencing took place for Jordan Spain in the shooting death of Syndia Garcia Tovar. The judge sentenced him to a total of 13 years in prison.

Officers responded to an incident on King Avenue where a male victim was stabbed multiple times by a family member. The suspect's vehicle was found abandoned in Fairfield and the suspect remains at large.
