Robbery – On April 29th, an armed robbery was reported as having occurred on Parkamo and Imlay at 11:18 p.m. The suspects were wearing ski masks, and this case is currently under investigation.

Drone Deployment – Midnight shift responded to the City of Hamilton to assist in locating a suspect who fled from them. A K9 Unit from another agency responded to assist, and our drone officer also responded. The drone pilot located the suspect, provided his location to other officers, and HPD took him into custody.

Medical Call/Assist EMS – Officers responded to the 2000 block of Pater Avenue due to a male injured from a tree that fell. Officer Swinney assessed the leg injury and observed bleeding and leg fractures, and applied a tourniquet until Fairfield Township Fire/EMS extracted the victim and transported him for further medical treatment.

Gunshot Wound – Officers responded to a wooded area by the riverbank at the dead-end of Canal/Headgates Road for a male with a gunshot wound to the leg. Officers assessed the area, and Officer Sizemore applied a tourniquet. Fairfield Township Fire/EMS and officers carried the victim out of the wooded area to the ambulance. It was determined there was no crime involved, and the victim accidentally shot himself in the leg.

Sex Offense – A juvenile reported that a family member sexually assaulted her. The case is under investigation by the Investigations Section.

Sex Offense – Our department received a tip regarding child sex abuse material being uploaded/shared at a house in the township. The Investigations Section is actively investigating this case.

Assault – Officers responded to Best Buy, Princeton Road, for a reported assault. Officers learned that the victim had been making inappropriate comments to employees. Another customer, hearing this, shoved the victim, causing minor injuries. The victim decided to pursue charges, and Best Buy management issued a no-trespassing order against the victim due to his behavior before the assault.

Deceased – Officers responded to the Hobby Lobby parking lot for a report of a deceased person in a car. The victim, who was previously reported missing, was found by family members. The victim had an apparent gunshot wound, and multiple officers responded to assist with the growing crowd and assist with the approximately 20+ family members and friends who showed up at the scene.
