Grant Reimbursement: \$1,316.18 for OVI Task Force hours worked in July 2026.

Vehicle Struck Police Car: An intoxicated female was driving a car in her subdivision when she struck a police car that was on the scene of another call in the area. The woman was arrested for OVI and Leaving the Scene of an Accident. Her insurance company reimbursed the township for damages to the police car.

Fatal Crash (Millikin Road/Greatus Drive): Evening shift officers were responding eastbound on Millikin Road to an emergency call with lights and sirens when several westbound vehicles slowed and moved to the right. A westbound vehicle then crested the hill and rear-ended one of the vehicles. Three people were transported for medical treatment, and the driver of the struck vehicle later died from their injuries. This crash remains under investigation.

Domestic Violence Suspect / Mutual Aid: Evening and midnight shift officers assisted multiple agencies in searching for a wanted domestic violence suspect who fled into a cornfield near Tylersville Road. Fairfield Township officers assisted with the perimeter and drone operations, and officers found the suspect hiding in dense brush. Officer Pottorf located and arrested the suspect.

Park Vandalism: Evening Shift officers identified and arrested a 14-year-old juvenile responsible for spray-painting playground equipment, signs, fencing, and other property at the Fairfax Avenue Pocket Park. Officers charged the juvenile with felony vandalism.

OVI Crash: Officers responded to a two-vehicle injury crash on Lakewood Drive where a pickup truck rear-ended a parked vehicle, causing the parked vehicle to go through a brick mailbox structure. The driver was found to be intoxicated and charged with OVI and failure to maintain reasonable control.



Missing Person Located: Detectives located an adult female who was reported missing by family members after her kids were left alone and they were unable to contact her for days. Detectives used Flock technology to obtain an area where the vehicle had been, and through a BOLO, deputies searched the area and found her, the car, and a male subject in Montgomery County.

Warrant Arrest: Evening shift officers located an individual walking on Princeton Road. Officers learned he had a parole violation warrant stemming from an original rape charge. The subject was arrested and transported to BC Jail.

Security Detail: Sgt. Miller responded with the Butler County Regional SWAT Team to provide event security for Vice President J.D. Vance's visit to AK Steel in Middletown, Ohio.

Snake Rescue: Officers responded to a report of a 5-foot boa constrictor inside a residence, only to find out it was a 2-foot-long, non-venomous native snake. Sergeant Miller safely relocated the house intruder to a nearby wooded area.

Drug Seizure / Warrant Operation / Identity Theft: Following an investigation into a woman who used the identity of her deceased identical twin to evade law enforcement, Sergeant Roach identified two additional relatives with numerous outstanding warrants. Midnight Shift officers conducted a surveillance and warrant operation in Fairfield, arresting all three suspects and seizing suspected heroin, fentanyl, crack cocaine, prescription drugs, syringes, and drug paraphernalia. Additional charges are pending.



Felony Warrant: On August 26, Midnight Shift officers conducted a warrant operation on Pater Avenue and arrested a female wanted on felony warrants after she refused to exit the residence. Officers took her into custody without further incident.

UPDATE – Sex Offense Case: Judge Dan Haughey overruled a defense attorney's motion to suppress evidence in State of Ohio vs. Jonathan Barber. Barber is indicted on over 30 counts of felony-2 child pornography charges.

UPDATE – Theft Case: Jacorion Wright pled guilty to felony theft after he and an accomplice were involved in a multi-state shoplifting

ring. This charge connects to a felony theft that he committed as part of his theft spree at Best Buy in Bridgewater Falls. Judge Greg Stephen subsequently imposed a 6-month prison sentence on Jacorion for this offense, while he still has multiple open cases pending from other jurisdictions throughout several states.

Felony Warrant: On August 28, Midnight Shift officers conducted a warrant operation on Tuley Road and arrested a male wanted on a felony warrant and a Hamilton Police Department bench warrant.

Breaking and Entering Assistance: Midnight Shift officers assisted the Hamilton Police Department with a reported breaking and entering. Officers conducted an extensive vehicle and drone search after concerns that the suspects may have fled into the Township, but did not locate anyone connected to the incident.

Five Outstanding Warrants: Following an investigation by Sergeant Roach, Midnight Shift officers located and arrested a female wanted on five outstanding warrants dating back to 2023 after she was found hiding inside a house on Parkamo Avenue.

Warrant Arrest / Drug Investigation: Midnight Shift officers stopped an individual for a pedestrian violation and discovered an active Hamilton Police Department warrant. The individual was arrested, and officers recovered a hypodermic needle containing a suspected controlled substance, which was submitted for laboratory analysis.



Community Interaction: While on patrol, Officer Fugett and Officer Pottorf spotted a lemonade stand on Harvard Street and stopped to support a young entrepreneur. The officers enjoyed a refreshing cup of lemonade and spent a few minutes visiting with her and her mother. It was a great way to connect with the community and enjoy a beautiful summer evening.

Medical Emergency: Midnight Shift officers responded to assist with an EMS call after an alarm company alerted a resident that what appeared to be leaves on the floor near her bathroom may have been blood. Officers and EMS arrived to find the caller suffering from an open wound and actively bleeding. She was transported to the hospital for treatment.

Mutual Aid / Officer Assistance: Midnight Shift officers responded to Hamilton and assisted Springfield Township officers. While responding to an officer who had a suspect at gunpoint, officers also assisted after another responding Springfield Township officer was involved in a crash. Fairfield Township officers coordinated information with Hamilton and assisted at both scenes.

U.S. Marshals Task Force: Sergeant Roach, who serves part-time as a Task Force Officer (TFO) with the U.S. Marshals Service, provided the following updates on cases:

- **Sex Offender Fugitive Arrest:** Conducted a warrant operation in Franklin and apprehended a fugitive wanted by the Hamilton Police Department on felony charges of gross sexual imposition, sexual battery, and intimidation of a witness.
- **Weapons Charges Fugitive Investigations:** Developed information on a fugitive wanted on a felony probation violation warrant related to previous Fairfield Township weapons charges.
- **Sex Offender Fugitive Arrest:** A fugitive with ties to Fairfield Township was wanted for failing to register as a sex offender. Officers assisted in the investigation, and an operation was conducted in Trenton, where the fugitive was located inside a residence and taken into custody.

- **Fugitive / Shooting Incident:** Conducted a warrant operation in Turtlecreek Township for a fugitive wanted in relation to a sex offense with a juvenile. As officers made repeated announcements and opened the front door, the fugitive fired a single gunshot inside the house; no officers discharged their weapons. The fugitive was later located dead inside the house from an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound, and the investigation was turned over to the Warren County Sheriff's Office.
- **Multiple Fugitive Arrests:** Conducted multiple warrant operations that led to the apprehension of fugitives wanted for felony weapons offenses, failure to register as a sex offender, aggravated vehicular assault, and improper handling of a firearm. One of the fugitives was located and arrested in Fairfield Township.
- **Felony Fugitive Arrest:** Task Force officers developed information that a fugitive wanted for methamphetamine possession was residing in Fairfield Township. A warrant operation took place at the fugitive's residence, and the fugitive was taken into custody and transported to the BC Jail.
