Temporary Holding Facility – Captain Lanier completed the annual audit and obtained certification from the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction to operate our temporary holding facility for Year 2026.

Grant Reimbursement – Captain Lanier filed and obtained \$1,212 from the Ohio Body Armor Grant Program, a 75% reimbursement for 2025 bulletproof vest expenses.

Arrest for Child Pornography – Detectives served a search warrant in July 2025 at a house on Springcrest Drive. After months of investigation, the Butler County Grand Jury returned an indictment charging Johnathan L. Barber with 34 combined counts of Pandering Obscenity Involving a Minor and Illegal Use of a Minor in Nudity Oriented Material, all felonies of the second degree. Barber is currently in the BC Jail on a \$250,000 bond and is awaiting trial.

Domestic Violence/Robbery – Officers responded to the 2900 Block of Cypress Hill for a Domestic Violence in progress. The male suspect was found to have stolen the keys to his mother’s vehicle and attacked her before fleeing the area on foot. Officers conducted a thorough canvas of the area, including a drone recon mission. The investigation section, working in tandem with Sgt. Roach (also with USMS SOFAST) located the suspect in a motel near Cincinnati. He was placed under arrest for Domestic Violence and Robbery.

Theft/Resisting Arrest – Evening Shift officers identified a theft suspect, Douglas Hillman, and later located him in Jessie’s Landing. Hillman resisted arrest, and while being transported to jail, he kicked the interior of the police car, busted the partition, and attempted to gain access to the front of the cruiser and the transporting officer. The transport officer was able to hold the partition window closed until other units arrived to help. He continued to be violent and resist officers, and it took several officers to restrain him so he could be transported to the BC Jail. He is currently charged with Theft, Resisting Arrest, Assault, and possible pending drug charges.

Vehicle Pursuit/Endangering Children – Officer Sizemore tried to stop a vehicle on State Route 129 near Hampshire Drive while working OVI Task Force hours. The driver of the vehicle, Jakiya Kazar Weaver, fled from Officer Sizemore while running at least one stop sign and eventually stopped in her driveway off Princeton Road. Weaver’s small child was in the vehicle at the time. Officer Sizemore arrested Weaver for Failure to Comply with the Order/Signal of a Police Officer (F-4) and Endangering Children (M-1).

Assault/Fight – Officers responded to a fight in progress at Urban Air, 3175 Princeton Road. A juvenile victim reported being assaulted by three males inside the business. Officers arrived on scene and arrested two juveniles and one adult male. The suspects were charged with assault and criminal trespass.

OVI/Drugs – Officers responded to the Speedway Gas Station, 3088 Creekside Drive, for a report of a reckless driver. Officers located the vehicle at the gas pumps and observed the driver exhibiting signs consistent with an overdose. After conducting standard field sobriety tests, the driver was arrested for OVI, possession of drugs, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Stolen Vehicle – A victim reported their camper stolen from Advantage Self Storage on Tylersville Road. Cincinnati Police later recovered the stolen camper in their city and arrested two subjects for Receiving Stolen Property.

OVI/Trespassing – Midnight Shift officers received a call for an individual trying to enter the caller's home. Upon further investigation, officers found a male suspect who was heavily intoxicated and confused that the house was not his home. The officers charged the male suspect with OVI.

Receiving Stolen Property (Motor Vehicle) – Following up on a Flock hit of a stolen vehicle, evening shift officers found the stolen vehicle in Bridgewater Falls. Officers located and arrested Destiny L. Davis for Receiving Stolen Property. Based on that arrest, detectives later identified Davis as a suspect in a felony theft from JCPenney's, for which she is now facing a separate F-5 Theft charge.

Shoplifting/Drugs – Officers responded to Kohl's for a theft report and located the male suspect near Princeton Road. The suspect failed to identify himself and gave false information, but officers were able to identify him using our portable fingerprint scanner. Officers found a drug pipe and potential narcotics in his pocket. He was booked into the BC Jail on warrants in addition to charges for Obstructing Official Business (M-2) and Theft (M-1). Additional drug charges are pending.

Crash/Pedestrian Strike - Officers responded to Princeton Road at Gilmore Road for a pedestrian struck by a vehicle. Officers discovered that the pedestrian was crossing/walking within a marked crosswalk when an at-fault driver failed to yield and struck her. The victim was transported to a local hospital with minor injuries. The driver was cited and released at the scene.

SWAT Response – Sgt. Miller and Ofc. Thompson were activated with the Butler County Regional SWAT Team for an intoxicated, armed, and barricaded male refusing to let his wife and children leave their home, in the city of Oxford. The suspect was taken into custody by the SWAT Team prior to the situation escalating into a Hostage Incident.

Training – Officers Tipton, Smith, and Prater attended the three-day Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) and Cops in Court course in Oxford. This training was funded by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and focused on advanced impaired-driving detection, drug-recognition indicators, and effective courtroom testimony.

Prosecutor's Office Training – Several officers with three years or less experience attended a one-day training hosted by the Butler County Prosecutor's Office. The training included advice, direction, and instruction for new officers on handling criminal cases, including search and seizure laws.
