Reimbursement – We received \$1,213.60 in overtime reimbursement for our continued participation with the Butler County OVI Task Force. This reimbursement was for hours worked in May 2026.

Task Force Funding – Sergeant Roach continues to work with the U.S. Marshals Service Joint Law Enforcement Operations Task Force. Through this partnership, the Police Department has received \$12,500 in overtime operational funding during Fiscal Year 2026.

Reimbursement – The Police Department received \$824.88 from the Ohio Attorney General's Office as reimbursement for law enforcement continuing professional training hours completed during the second quarter.

Search Warrant – The Investigations Section obtained and served two search warrants as part of an ongoing investigation involving the Fairfield Township business, Xtreme Bagger Audio. One search warrant was served at a location in Wayne Township, while the second was served at the business on Wesley Way. The investigation stems from multiple customer complaints alleging the business failed to return motorcycles, switched parts between motorcycles, and used various delaying tactics to avoid completing work. Several complainants reported their motorcycles were returned in worse condition than when they were dropped off, while others stated their motorcycles have remained at the business for years without being returned. The police department was able to recover the four victims' motorcycles, and the BC Prosecutor's office is currently reviewing the case.

Sex Offense – Detectives investigated a public indecency incident that occurred at Barnes & Noble in Bridgewater Falls Shopping Center. Detectives identified the suspect, a 44-year-old Cincinnati man with a history of similar offenses. We coordinated with Hamilton County Parole Officers, and they located and arrested him for a parole violation. He will be facing our Public Indecency charge in Butler County Area II Court.

Fatal Crash – On June 10, 2026, Officers responded to a serious injury crash involving a motorcycle and an SUV at the intersection of SR4 and Walden Ponds Circle. The motorcyclist sustained life-threatening injuries and was transported by Air Care to the hospital, where he died several days later.

Criminal Damaging/Mental Health – Officers responded to a report of criminal damaging and an injured male. The investigation determined the male had broken a house window while attempting to contact his ex-girlfriend, resulting in severe injuries to himself. EMS treated and transported the male, and the homeowner declined to pursue criminal charges.

Animal Call – Officers Stebbins and Prater assisted a resident who located an injured fawn in a neighborhood. They determined that the animal was injured and required assistance; the officers coordinated its care, and Sergeant VandeRyt transported the fawn to a licensed wildlife rehabilitation center, where it received specialized care. We have learned that after some extensive treatment, the fawn was successfully rehabilitated and is thriving.

Training – Officers finished the annual firearms qualifications with their duty pistol, patrol rifle, and beanbag shotgun, while also participating in training exercises designed to reinforce firearm proficiency, safe handling, and operational readiness. Thank you to Sergeant Roach and Sergeant Miller for coordinating the training and ensuring a safe and productive day on the range.

Drone Deployments – 06/10/2026 Officer Caldwell obtained aerial photos and videos of the fatal motorcycle crash investigation.

Drone Deployment – 06/18/2026 Captain Lanier provided aerial overwatch and search efforts at two different locations during the service of two search warrants.

Drone Deployment – 06/20/2026 Officer Smith searched the area of Fairfax/Belmont after a report of a suspicious person who may be breaking into cars. UTL and no victims reported any thefts.



Drone Deployment – 06/25/2026 Officer Smith assisted the Butler County Sheriff’s Office in Liberty Township with the search for a suspect in violation of a temporary protection order. It was unknown whether the suspect was still in the area, and Smith conducted a 35-minute canvass. UTL and the Sheriff’s Office signed charges.

Drone Deployment – 06/29/2026 Officer Smith captured photos and video of the extinguished structure fire on Elora Lane. Photos and videos were provided to Interim Fire Chief Jeffers for fire department use.

Overdose Response – Officers responded to the backyard shed of a residence for a reported overdose, where the caller had already administered two doses of Narcan. Officers were able to wake the male subject, who admitted to using fentanyl. FTFD EMS transported him for medical evaluation.

Drugs/Arrest – Officers conducted a field interview that resulted in the arrest of an individual with an active warrant. During the investigation, officers also recovered suspected controlled substances and drug paraphernalia. The evidence was submitted for laboratory analysis, with additional charges pending, and the individual was transported to the BC Jail.

Protection Order Violation – Officers investigated a reported Domestic Violence Civil Protection Order violation after a protected party received multiple unwanted phone calls from a former partner. Officers identified the suspect, located him in Middletown with assistance from the Butler County Sheriff's Office, and arrested him. He was transported and booked into the BC Jail.

Menacing – Officers responded to reports of threats and gunfire that were tied to a dispute involving former partners. During the investigation, officers located a bullet hole in a vehicle and recovered the projectile as evidence. One individual was arrested on related charges.

Warrant Arrest – While on patrol, an officer noticed an open front door at a house and conducted a welfare check on the residents to ensure there was no foul play. During the investigation, officers learned an individual with an outstanding warrant was hiding inside the residence. The suspect was located and taken into custody without incident.

Mental Health Crisis Response – Officers responded to a report of a missing and suicidal adult after family members reported the individual had threatened self-harm before leaving the residence. Using technology, Officers were able to search for the individual and coordinated with the Ohio State Highway Patrol, who located the individual at a nearby rest area. The subject was transported for evaluation and placed on an emergency medical hold.

SWAT – Fairfield Township Officers who are members of the BC Regional SWAT team assisted the BC Undercover Regional Narcotics Task Force. They served a search warrant in a neighboring jurisdiction as part of a drug trafficking and dangerous ordnance investigation. The operation resulted in the seizure of evidence that will support the ongoing investigation and prosecution of multiple suspects.

Sex Offense Inv. Juvenile Victims – The Investigations Section is actively investigating the alleged sexual assault of two children by an adult immediate family member.

Large Fight – Officers responded to Imlay/Allstatter for a fight involving 6 – 7 people. One male sustained an injury; however, none of the involved parties were willing to cooperate with the investigation. Shortly after, there was an altercation involving 4- 6 people on a nearby road. Again, there continued to be a lack of cooperation between the involved parties.
