Suicide/GSW – Patrol officers received a call for a welfare check in the 7300 block of Betsy Ross Court. The male resident made several calls to the dispatch center but would not respond to officers' attempts to speak with them. The following morning, officers received an additional call from the resident's employer after he did not show up for work. The Fairfield Township Drone was utilized for reconnaissance and oversight during officers' approach. After forcing entry into the home, officers discovered the resident deceased from a suspected self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Dispute/Drugs – Day Shift officers responded to a dispute call in the 3400 block of Waterfowl Lane. They contacted Damian Anderson, who tried to toss away drugs as he spoke with officers. After a brief struggle, officers arrested Damian and discovered the methamphetamine that Damian had thrown down. Damian is now under indictment for Possession of Drugs (F-5), Tampering with Evidence (F-3), and Obstructing Official Business (M-2). His case is pending in Butler County Common Pleas Court. Damian is also facing a parole violation from a prior conviction.

Suspicious Activity/Person – Patrol officers responded to Community Christian Church at 3401 Millikin Road for a suspicious male. The male was loitering on the property and telling people that the world was ending and an earthquake was coming, while also talking about starting a fire. Officers found the male walking on Saratoga Drive and determined he suffers from mental health problems. The officers took the man to Atrium Medical Center for a psychological evaluation.

OVI Crash – Midnight Shift officers responded to the area of Township Tavern on Hamilton Middletown Road for a crash. Upon their arrival, they figured out that the driver was under the influence of alcohol. Officers arrested the driver and found an open container of alcohol. The driver submitted a breath test, which was a BAC of .183. They booked the driver into jail on the OVI charges and the open container.

Medical Emergency – Midnight Shift officers responded to an unconscious person on Hickoryview Drive. When they arrived, officers found the victim did not have a pulse. After performing CPR on the victim, paramedics transported the victim to Bethesda Butler Hospital.

OVI Crash – On March 29, 2026, Midnight Shift officers found a vehicle along SR4 Bypass near Hamilton Mason Road, which appeared to have been involved in a crash. They found the driver and determined he was under the influence of alcohol and in possession of a firearm. Officers arrested the driver and charged him with OVI and firearms offenses before booking him into the BC Jail.

Assist PDs on OVI Checkpoints – Several of our patrol officers helped Middletown and Hamilton Police Departments with OVI checkpoints throughout the month. The officers receive their pay through the Butler County OVI Task Force.

Training – Several officers attended a training hosted by the Butler County Prosecuting Attorney’s Office. The training included a lecture from prosecutors to teach new officers how to prepare cases for court, grand jury, evidence collection, report writing, and other search and seizure topics.

Assist PD/Domestic Violence Arrest – Evening Shift Officer Dominic Swinney investigated a suspicious vehicle complaint at Birchwood Care Center on Hamilton Mason Road. The vehicle left, and Officer Swinney located it at Speedway on Tylersville Road. The occupants gave false information; however, Officer Swinney determined their identity and arrested one of them for Domestic Violence warrants out of Hamilton PD.

Indictment (Theft of Firearm) – The Butler County Grand Jury handed down an indictment charging Jason Burke with Grand Theft of a Firearm (F-3) on March 30, 2026. This charge stems from an investigation by Detective Meghan Robinson after a resident on Canal Road reported that her ex-boyfriend stole her handgun. During the investigation, detectives discovered that Burke pawned the gun at a pawn shop in Dayton, OH. The firearm has been returned to its owner. The criminal case is pending in Butler County Common Pleas Court.

Search Warrant/SWAT – Fairfield Township Detectives and Patrol Officers, along with Butler County SWAT and the Butler County Bomb Unit, served a search warrant on March 31st at 1944 Fairfax Avenue. This warrant stems from an ongoing sexual grooming investigation where 43-year-old Adam Kendel has been allegedly communicating with a 10-year-old female and a 16-year-old female. He was also alleged to have sexually assaulted one of the victims in Kentucky. The suspect made statements that he had enough food and ammunition to last him six months, barricaded his doors and windows, and had access to explosives. Upon contact, he ran out the back door, and the Fairfield Township Drone tracked him in the dark as midnight shift Officer Steele gave chase and caught him. Detectives seized electronics and other evidence from this house, and a subsequent search took place at a second location in Hamilton. At the Hamilton address, detectives seized 17 firearms, including a saw-off shotgun and other restricted firearms. Local charges are pending consultation with the Butler County Prosecutor’s Office, the ATF, and other entities. Kendel is in custody and awaiting extradition for an outstanding felony warrant out of Kentucky related to his alleged sexual activity with a ten-year-old victim. The suspect is already a Tier II Sex Offender due to an earlier conviction in 2009 for Unlawful Sexual Conduct with a Minor.



Organized Retail Theft Arrest – Detectives and patrol officers took Heather Machel Webb into custody at Walmart. Webb is part of a retail theft ring and has multiple outstanding warrants for her arrest throughout Ohio and Kentucky. Kettering PD detectives came to speak with Webb. She is charged with Theft and Possessing Criminal Tools; however, additional charges may be pending further investigation.
