Sergeant Terry Viel received an award as the 2025 Butler County CIT Officer of the Year for his work on the LOSS/DOSS Program, which assists surviving family members whose loved ones are lost from suicide or accidental drug overdose.

Captain Doug Lanier and Sergeant Brandon McCroskey attended the Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police (OACP) Chief's Conference April 27 through April 29 in Columbus, OH.

Officers attended Defensive Tactics/Police Jiu Jitsu training instructed by Sergeant Ryan Roach.

April 25, 2025, McCroskey, Viel, Caldwell, Coy, and Stebbins completed a 1-day instructor's course to certify officers on our agency's new Taser-10 platform. Throughout the next month, the five who attended this certification course will certify all other sworn personnel on the new Taser-10 platform.

The majority of sworn personnel completed our annual firearms re-qualifications which includes duty weapons, off-duty weapons, less-lethal shotguns, and patrol rifles.

April 28, 2025, Officer Kennedy Sizemore officially graduated from Butler Tech's Basic Peace Officer Training Academy – *Congratulations!*

Several officers and supervisors received their certification on the new Intoxilyzer breath test machine, which officers will use to assess breath alcohol content for suspected OVI drivers.

April 22, 2025, Evening Shift officers responded to a motorcycle crash on S.R. 129 near the 17-mile marker. The motorcycle struck a small bus. The driver of the motorcycle sustained severe injuries but is expected to survive.

Midnight Shift officers responded to the area of Osage Drive for a suicidal subject armed with a knife who wanted officers to "kill" him. Through de-escalation, officers eventually took the individual into custody without anyone sustaining any injuries.

Midnight Shift officers made several OVI-related arrests on impaired drivers.

April 30, 2025, at about 5:35 a.m., Day Shift officers responded to Liberty Fairfield Road just south of the Wayne Madison bridge for a head-on motor vehicle crash. Both drivers sustained severe injuries and are last known to be in critical condition at local hospitals.

Police personnel participated in several events this month including the Easter Egg Drop, Spring Clean Up, and the National Drug Takeback.
