Shooting Suspect Sentenced – On September 14, 2024, officers and detectives investigated a shooting that occurred on Harvard Street. The male suspect, Dakota Price, fired a shotgun into a car with multiple juveniles inside. Fortunately, no one was seriously injured, and detectives charged Price with multiple counts of Felonious Assault, Tampering with Evidence, and Having Weapons Under Disability. After a guilty plea in Butler County Common Pleas Court, Judge Keith Spaeth sentenced Price to 5 years in the Ohio Department of Corrections.

Fatal Hit-Skip Crash – Evening Shift Patrol Officers responded to the area of Tylersville Road near Exeter Avenue for a female lying in the roadway. Upon arriving, officers determined that a vehicle had struck a 72-year-old female and then fled the scene. The victim died at the West Chester Medical Center. Investigators identified the car and its driver that hit the victim. Charges are pending against the driver for felony Leaving the Scene of a Fatal Crash.

Vehicle Pursuit/OVI/Drug Offenses – Officer Sizemore found a potentially intoxicated driver. Passers-by reported the driver as having passed out behind the wheel a short time before in the City of Hamilton. When Officer Sizemore attempted to stop the suspect vehicle, the driver, Garrett Z. McKay, failed to stop and fled from the officer. The chase led officers to SR747 in West Chester, where McKay exited his vehicle and ran before quickly being apprehended by Officer Sizemore and taken into custody. McKay is charged with felony Failure to Comply with Order/Signal of a Police Officer, Possessing Drug Abuse Instruments, Obstructing Official Business, Drug Paraphernalia, Driving Under Suspension, and outstanding (felony) warrants for his arrest.

Critically Missing Person – Midnight Shift Patrol Officers received a call of a missing elderly resident from StoryPoint on Gilmore Road. Staff reported that a 69-year-old resident, suffering from memory and medical issues, left the facility in the evening but never returned. Officers and staff members found the victim with a broken leg in a wooded area near the facility. Medics transported the victim to the hospital for treatment.

Critically Missing Person – Officers found a man in the Walmart parking lot who West Chester Police reported earlier as a critical missing person after he made suicidal statements. Multiple other local law enforcement agencies worked together to find the man. Fairfield Township Officers found the man uninjured and assisted him with resources and getting assistance.

Armed Suspect - Assist Hamilton Police – Sergeant Ryan Roach responded with multiple Hamilton officers to Waffle House on High Street for a naked man armed with a knife in the restaurant. During de-escalation efforts, Sergeant Roach was able to tase the suspect in the building along with Hamilton PD. Hamilton PD took the subject into custody after medics evaluated him.

Burglary/Protection Order Violation – Midnight Shift officers found suspect, Pamela Rose, hiding around Cypress Hill Drive following an earlier incident. Pamela broke into her ex-boyfriend's family's home, violated a protection order, and stole items from the house. Pamela is charged with Violation of a Protection Order and Burglary.

School Threats/Menacing – Investigations Section worked with Day Shift Patrol in investigating a male student at Fairfield Preparatory Academy on Princeton Road who threatened to kill other students. Detectives charged the male juvenile with Aggravated Menacing in the Butler County Juvenile Court.

Domestic Violence & Strangulation – Day Shift Officers investigated a report where a female reported that her boyfriend physically assaulted and strangled her during an argument. Further investigation revealed that a similar incident had occurred between the two earlier that day in West Chester. Fairfield Township Officers charged the male suspect with felony Strangulation and Domestic Violence. West Chester PD also charged the male suspect with the incident in their jurisdiction.

Intoxicated Person – Officers responded to Bob Evans on Indian Meadows Drive for an intoxicated male causing a disturbance. Upon their arrival, officers found a homeless male suspect who continued to be disruptive and was causing a disturbance. Officers charged the male suspect with Disorderly Conduct before taking him to a local homeless shelter.

Suicidal Person – Day Shift Officers responded to the 7100 block of Iron Kettle Drive for a male having a psychiatric emergency, also threatening suicide, and believing his family was trying to harm him. Officers took the male to a local hospital for psychiatric treatment.

Shoplifting/Pursuit – Officers attempted to stop a vehicle with two female shoplifting suspects from Kohl's; however, the suspects failed to stop and fled from the officers. Due to conditions and heavy traffic, the officers stopped the pursuit. Through follow-up investigation, officers identified the suspects and have since signed warrants for their arrest.

Training – Several detectives and officers (evidence technicians) attended an Asphyxiation-Strangulation Symposium at the Montgomery County Coroner's Office and Miami Valley Regional Crime Lab. Topics covered were Prosecuting Strangulation Cases, Medical Findings in Non-Fatal Strangulation, Asphyxia Findings in Autopsy, and Processing Asphyxiation Scenes.

Breaking & Entering – Midnight shift officers responded to an alarm at Casey's gas station on Princeton Road and found a shattered door and glass on the ground. At the same time, Sergeant Roach was in the police department office and heard noise outside his window. He looked out and saw a male subject, Zachary Brown, lurking around the PD. Roach ascertained that Brown had broken into the gas station, and it was unknown what his intentions were at the police department had Roach not found him. Brown was charged and booked into the BC Jail for Breaking and Entering, Theft, and a pending Vandalism charge.
