

Calls for Service








- There are 167 different CFS types provided from the CAD
- Higher numbers include:
 - 911 hang-ups/open lines which may or may not equate to a crime
 - Traffic stops
 - Civil serve paperwork
 - Traffic crashes
 - Reckless operator reported
 - Welfare checks
 - Alarms (business and residential)
 - Extra patrol requests (e.g., for reported crimes, concerns, problems)
 - Suspicious persons/vehicles
 - Lock-outs
 - Thefts
 - Fraudulent activity
 - Unwanted persons/disputes/harassment/domestic
 - Emotionally Disturbed Persons (EDPs)



 Understanding there are some outliers (as reported by some agencies), of the 200 agencies reported on the list, we rank at **191** out of the **200** when it comes to providing full-time officers per 1000 population.



- We rank at 191 out of the 200 per 1000 population
- Per capita approach: 1.8 2.6 =
 41.4 to 59.8 per 1000 population
- Most accurate formula used in 2017: 10,785 total calls/371.89 calls per officer/month = 28 call takers
- 2021: **13,247** total calls/**371.89** calls per officer/month = **35.6** call takers
