FAIRFIELD TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION NO. 18-88

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF (25) TWENTY-FIVE GLOCK PISTOLS AND ACCESSORIES FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FROM KIESLER'S POLICE SUPPLY, INC., AT A TOTAL COST OF \$6,233.30.

WHEREAS: The Police Chief has determined that in order to properly equip the officers and to ensure their safety, it is necessary to purchase 25 new Glock Pistols and accompanying accessories; and

WHEREAS: The total cost of the purchase will be \$16,785.27, minus trade-in which brings the cost down to \$6,233.30; and

WHEREAS: These items will be purchased out of Fund No. 2081-210-420-000;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Fairfield Township, Butler County, Ohio, as follows;

- SECTION 1: The Board hereby approves the purchase of (25) twenty-five Glock Pistols and accessories for the Police Department from Kiesler's Police Supply, Inc., at a total cost of \$6,233.30 after trade in, as described on the quote attached hereto as Exhibit "A" which includes the items to be purchased and the items to be traded.
- **SECTION 2:** The Board hereby dispenses with the requirement that this resolution be read on two separate days, pursuant to RC 504.10, and authorizes the adoption of this resolution upon its first reading.
- SECTION 3 This resolution is the subject of the general authority granted to the Board of Trustees through the Ohio Revised Code and not the specific authority granted to the Board of Trustees through the status as a Limited Home Rule Township.
- SECTION 4: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5: This resolution shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

Trade Purchase of Weapons

Mrs, Vonderhaar:

In continuing to review Fairfield Township Police Departmental needs, I was recently advised that the issued Glock pistols have not received routine maintenance since they were purchased in 2001 (the most recent ones). In addition to the gradual normal degradation of the Internal workings of the Glocks through time, this has also caused the rear trijicon night sights to lose their illumination for low-level or no light shooting situations. The lack of maintenance could cause the weapon to malfunction and the loss of the rear sights may cause significant safety problems for a police officer if involved in a gunfight especially during darkness. In short, the loss of the Illumination on the rear sights could cause an officer not to be able to see the rear sight and align it with the front sight in order to make an accurate shot. Gunfights are intrinsically rapidly evolving high adrenalin situations requiring split second decisions. The trijicon sights assists the officer in proper target acquisition during these high stress incidents.

Further research of the FTPD weapons inventory revealed that the newest pistols were purchased approximately 17 years ago. Well-maintained Glocks generally last 10 years with proper yearly upkeep and maintenance. The newest FTPD pistols are 7 years past the acceptable 10-year time frame and have never been updated.

Further research into our current issued pistols revealed the following:

- Two different pistol calibers have been issued the 40 and the 45. This causes 2 types of ammunition to be purchased, inventoried and stored and also causes 2 types of holsters, magazine carriers, etc., to be purchased and issued to personnel. One caliber weapon eliminates this and also allows officers to interchange ammunition and the weapon, if necessary, during extended gunfights.
- Currently, weapons are not issued with flashlight mounts, but should be as it enhances officer safety. I have included the purchase of mounted weapons in the attached order.
- No inspections or maintenance have occurred since the pistols were purchased 17 or more years ago. Although records are very sparse, we have determined that the most recently purchased pistols were obtained in May and June of 2001. To adequately maintain weapons, they should be inspected yearly so that all components of the pistols are checked and fixed or replaced if needed. A Policy to address this lack of maintenance will be authored in the near future and our new range officers will be attending range instructor and Glock Armorers courses.

No weapons maintenance log book exists, which could be an issue in civil litigation as we do not
have any maintenance history on FTPD weapons. While the serial number of the weapons have
been recorded during yearly qualifications, there is no documentation of upkeep or maintenance
of the weapons because it has not occurred. This will also be included in the forthcoming Policy.

In order to streamline the issued pistol and in researching the best caliber for the best price, the new technology of the 9-mm round was tested against the 45 caliber round during a ballistic workshop hosted by the Middletown Police Department on May 9th. This test revealed that the 9-mm round resulted in nearly the same ballistics as the 45 caliber. The difference in wound cavitation (the expansion and contraction of tissue caused by the trajectory of the round) and penetration (how deep the round penetrates) were negligible.

A cost comparison between the 9-mm and the 45 caliber Glocks reveals that the 9-mm is \$409.00 and the 45 Glock is \$814.00. Clearly, the 9-mm is easy to justify based on the cost and the very negligible differences between the rounds. It is important to note that the 40 caliber was not tested as the round's ballistics do not compare to the 9-mm or the 45 and costs significantly more than the 9-mm.

The attached quote includes:

- 25 9-mm pistols, which provides spares in case our officer(s) are involved in shooting incidents
 and their weapons are placed in evidence, or a weapon malfunctions and needs to be replaced
 while being repaired.
- 25 ALS holsters to accommodate the 9-mm pistol and spares based on the above
- 25 magazine holders to accommodate the 9 mm magazines
- 25 lights for the Glock pistols

• Trade purchase of numerous assorted old weapons and items that are no longer needed or have been turned over to us by the courts.
