# RESOLUTION AWARDING PARAMEDIC TUITION PAYMENT TO FIREFIGHTER/EMT NATHAN PIERANI AT A TOTAL COST OF \$9,451.00.

**WHEREAS:** The Township has expressed a desire to assist in the education of members of the Fire Department wishing to become Paramedics; and

**WHEREAS:** Nathan Pierani has expressed an interest in attending Paramedic training and meets the requirements of the Tuition Program; and

WHEREAS: The Fire Chief has recommended awarding the tuition; and

WHEREAS: Firefighter Pierani has agreed to all contract requirements to receive the tuition; and

WHEREAS: The program was created and approved by Resolution #16-26;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of Trustees of Fairfield Township, Butler County, Ohio, as follows;

- SECTION 1: The Board hereby authorizes payment for Paramedic tuition to Firefighter/EMT Nathan Pierani, at a total cost of \$9,451.00, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and will be paid out of Fund No. 2281-230-318 pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in Exhibit "A" and Resolution No. 16-26.
- **SECTION 2:** The Board hereby dispenses with the requirement that this resolution be read on two separate days, pursuant to RC 504.10, and authorizes the adoption of this resolution upon its first reading.
- SECTION 3 This resolution is the subject of the general authority granted to the Board of Trustees through the Ohio Revised Code and not the specific authority granted to the Board of Trustees through the status as a Limited Home Rule Township.
- SECTION 4: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**SECTION 5:** This resolution shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.
