FAIRFIELD TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION NO. 25-85

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF DAYTON AND THE FAIRFIELD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE 2025 NORTH ATLANTIC TREATY ORGANIZATION PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY.

WHEREAS: The City of Dayton is hosting the 2025 North Atlantic Treaty Organization Parliamentary Assembly scheduled to take place at various locations in and around Dayton, Ohio from May 22, 2025 to May 26, 2025; and

WHEREAS: The City of Dayton has requested mutual aid from Fairfield Township by the exchange and use of their respective police department personnel and equipment; and

WHEREAS: The Fairfield Township Board of Trustees agree to provide mutual aid to the City of Dayton; and

WHEREAS: The Township shall be reimbursed for any overtime in an amount not to exceed \$25,502.13; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Fairfield Township, Butler County, Ohio, as follows;

- SECTION 1: The Board hereby authorizes the Township Administrator to Execute Mutual Aid Agreement Between the City of Dayton and the Fairfield Township Board of Trustees for the 2025 North Atlantic Treaty Organization Parliamentary Assembly.
- **SECTION 2:** The Board hereby dispenses with the requirement that this resolution be read on two separate days, pursuant to RC 504.10, and authorizes the adoption of this resolution upon It's first reading.
- SECTION 3 This resolution is the subject of the general authority granted to the Board of Trustees through the Ohio Revised Code and not the specific authority granted to the Board of Trustees through the status as a Limited Home Rule Township.
- SECTION 4: That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including §121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5: This resolution shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

AUTHENTICATION

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE

CITY OF DAYTON AND THE FAIRFIELD TOWNSHIP for the 2025 North Atlantic Treaty Organization Parliamentary Assembly

This Mutual Aid Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this 8th day of May, by and between the City of Dayton, Ohio ("City") and the Fairfield Township, jointly referred to as "Parties".

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Agreement is to provide a framework for mutual aid and cooperation between the Parties to ensure adequate public safety, emergency management, and logistical support in preparation for and during the 2025 North Atlantic Treaty Organization Parliamentary Assembly ("Event"), scheduled to take place at various locations in and around Dayton, Ohio from May 22, 2025 to May 26, 2025; and

WHEREAS, these Parties desire to provide for mutual assistance by the exchange and use of their respective police department personnel and equipment, and

WHEREAS, these Parties have the power to enter into contracts for the purpose of providing police services in other political subdivisions, under Ohio Revised Code Sections 311.07, 505.43, 511.235, 737.04, and 1545.131;

NOW THEREFORE, be it agreed, by the Parties hereto, each in consideration of the mutual promises and obligations herein by the other:

SECTION 1. In the event of an emergency as defined in Ohio Revised Code Chapter 2744 or determined by the entity requiring assistance, each political subdivision agrees to furnish upon request such police services as are requested by the other insofar as such services are available in the opinion of the Chief of Police or highest ranking on-duty police supervisor of the subdivision from whom assistance is requested.

SECTION 2. From May 20, 2025, to May 27, 2025, the Fairfield Township may provide police services to the City of Dayton as requested by the City of Dayton insofar as such services are available. Request for non-emergency police services shall be approved by the Chief of Police on behalf of the Fairfield Township, and by the Chief of Police or designee on behalf of the City of Dayton.

SECTION 3. It is agreed that there shall be no reimbursement for loss or damage to equipment or other property while engaged in activity in accordance with this agreement.

SECTION 4. It is further agreed that police department personnel acting outside the subdivision in which they are employed may participate in any pension or indemnity fund established by their employer to the same extent as while acting within the employing subdivision. Those members shall be entitled to all the rights and the benefits of Chapter 4123 of the Ohio Revised Code, to the same extent as while performing services within the subdivision in which they are employed.

SECTION 5. It is further agreed that reimbursement for any approved personnel expenses related to the Event will be reimbursed by the City of Dayton, which will utilize this agreement for the maximum reimbursement amount. Requirements for reimbursement will be contingent upon Ohio Emergency Management Agency ("Ohio EMA") requirements as dictated by the fully executed grant agreement between the Ohio EMA and the City. As agreed upon by the Parties, the maximum cost reimbursement based on actual overtime wage and fringe expenses will be \$ 25,503.13. All documentation needed for reimbursement must be provided to the City no later than June 13, 2025, or reimbursement will not be approved.

SECTION 6. It is further agreed that the senior police officer who is in charge of the Party that requested such assistance shall have full charge and authority over any assisting equipment and personnel responding to such a request.

SECTION 7. It is further agreed that all personnel of the responding political subdivision, when responding to a call for assistance, shall be acting within the scope of their employment while traveling to and from and acting within the territory of the requesting Party's jurisdiction. It is further agreed that Chapter 2744 of the Ohio Revised Code, insofar as it applies to the operation of police departments, shall apply to the Parties and their personnel when they are rendering service outside their own jurisdiction pursuant to this agreement.

SECTION 8. It is mutually agreed by the Parties that if a request for assistance is denied, delayed, inadequate, or, if furnished assistance is not needed upon arrival, there shall be no liability, responsibility, nor cause of action for breach of this contract.

SECTION 9. It is mutually agreed by all Parties to this compact that they will commit to the development of written implementation and operational procedures.

SECTION 10. This agreement is solely intended for the Event and does not change or modify existing Mutual Aid Agreements between the Parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Fairfield Township, Butler County, Ohio and the City of Dayton, Montgomery County, Ohio have accepted this agreement hereunto duly authorized by Ohio Revised Code Section 505.43, 511.235, 737.04, and 1545.131.
