• Mr. Ken Geis - Presentation regarding Joint Economic Development District – A joint Economic Development District (JEDD) creates a partnership between a municipality and a township, with the goal of developing township land. Each JEDD comes with an income tax that is split between the township and municipality, based on what services they each provide. Each JEDD is unique in how it is structured, as different services are offered by each participating entity. The City of Hamilton has three JEDD's. JEDD 1 and 11 are located at Bridgewater Falls. JEDD 111 is located south of Bridgewater Falls, southwest of State Route 129 and Bypass 4. The Third Amendment to the Joint Economic Development District will promote economic development in Fairfield Township, the City of Hamilton, Butler County, and the State of Ohio.

• Mr. Ken Geis – Presentation <u>City of Fairfield-Fairfield Township Joint</u> <u>Economic Development District 1</u>

The City of Fairfield has entered into multi-jurisdictional agreements with two neighboring townships (Fairfield and West Chester) to facilitate economic development projects. Within the JEDD areas, businesses and employees are subject to municipal income taxes administered by the city. Effective December 15, 2022, business and

employees working within the JEDD are required to pay municipal incomes. A 1.5% tax shall be due on net profits and or qualifying wages earned within the JEDD. The JEDD encompasses <75 acres of Fairfield Township on the east side of Seward Road. There are currently two affected addresses:

- 1. 7950 Seward Road, Hamilton, OH 45011
- 2. 8200 Seward Road, Hamilton, OH 45011

Mr. Berding - It seems to me, given the comments, we should look at compensation of the employees. I would definitely like to see a 5-year plan.

Mrs. Hartkemeyer - I would like to continue our marketing and branding efforts. **Mr. McAbee** - I'd like to see a citizens' group involved to see what they think.

ITEMS FOR BOARD DISCUSSION

• <u>ODOT US Bike Route Signage Project</u> – Administrator Julie Vonderhaar ODOT has initiated a statewide signage initiative. ODOT is asking all surrounding areas to participate in this project. ODOT intends to purchase and install signage for designated bike routes. We would have 14 locations and 28 signs. We would maintain the signs after that.

Mr. Berding - What is the cost every year to maintain these signs? **Mr. Bennett** – There isn't a lot of maintenance for these signs.

• <u>Fire Department Issues</u> – Chief Thomas - Pay Increase for part-time staff. Staffing continues to be an ongoing issue. We made our last pay adjustment in 2016. We are now at the bottom of pay scale again. We are trying to draw additional staffing and keep our people. Many of our people have full-time jobs. We're hoping if we can increase our funds, we can add some additional part-time staff. We have funds available to increase our staff. We did apply for a SAFER Grant to hire additional staff but did not receive it. Last year we spent over \$140,000 on overtime. My

recommendation to the Board is to hire 3 additional personnel. **Mrs. Hartkemeyer** - I think we need to definitely look at increasing wages. Can we apply for the SAFER Grant again this year? **Chief Thomas** - We will be better prepared for next year. **Mrs. Hartkemeyer** - I would definitely like to see it this year. **Chief Thomas** - I will do my best to get a grant submitted.

TID – Trustee McAbee – Update on North Hamilton Crossing. We agreed we would follow the ODOT regulations and keep the project moving. I would encourage everyone in Fairfield Township to go to the website https://northhamiltoncrossing.org/ to make your opinion known. We don't want them to take the farmland from the Bonham's. The Board should support the Bonham's.

Mrs. Hartkemeyer - I can't support something that would not meet the needs of your family.

Mr. Berding - I'm not opposed to the Hamilton Crossing. I'm opposed to it going through the Bonham Farm without the family's consent and agreeable compensation. I can work with the law director to work on a legal statement and bring it to the next meeting opposing this going through the Bonham Farm.

Mr. McAbee - We can have the Administrator deliver our statement to Dan Corey, director of the Butler County TID and Allen Messer, Hamilton's Assistant Director of Engineering.

Mr. McAbee – There was some comment at the end of the meeting about the City of Fairfield may look for some money for right-of-way at Tylersville and Seward Road. They apparently are going to have us pay for a round-a-bout.

EMA – Trustee Hartkemeyer – Nothing at this time.

OKI – Trustee Hartkemeyer - Carbon update and EV charging stations.

CLOUT – Trustee Hartkemeyer – Fairfield Township is now the 24th largest township in Ohio. There might be a meeting for the Southwest region coming up.

OTHER – Trustee Hartkemeyer – I've been serving on a Butler County Task Force for housing initiatives to help people. There is a possibility of a crisis stabilization center being put behind the board of elections. This would be a 24-hour, short term residential program that offers patients and family a cooling off period from a particular crisis. This would be put into an existing facility. Technically this is in the City of Hamilton but very close to Fairfield Township. I'd like to have a meeting with our Chiefs and Doctor Rasmussen to talk about how this works for Fairfield Township. I've asked Mrs. Vonderhaar to set up a meeting.

DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT

Zoning – Chuck Goins

419 zoning certificates 2022. There have been significant residential and commercial improvements in the township. We issued certificates for 56 single family homes, and 33 multi-family units. Residential developments have really been moving forward over the past couple years. Casey's is well under way on construction; they are planning to

open in March. Tidal Way Auto Spa is moving forward; we're reviewing the zoning plans right now. Starbucks looks like they are moving forward on their plans. Update on Johnson's; they are still hung-up in Butler County Building Department. They are hopeful they will get their final approval this month. Christian Brothers received their final PUD in early 2022. We still haven't heard anything from them. We did review and approved a remodel for Target. Looks like they will be doing a little interior and exterior facelift. There is a lot of development going on Seward Road. The 312,000 square foot building is complete. The 500 square foot building is scheduled for this year.

<u>Property Maintenance</u> – A lot of zoning violations. I do want to thank Nick Armstrong for all his work. He has been a huge asset in the office. He has a way of convincing angry property owners that it's a good idea to address their issues. We received 364 property and zoning violations in 2022. We resolved 360 of them.

If they do accept the offer, then we'll acquire the property and there is a 10% match for funds. The total project cost is \$487,712. Butler County land bank thinks there may be some money available. At this point I just need approval to move forward with this project. This will be returned to a green space. Funds will be available immediately.
