Chuck Goins - Similar Use Determination for Camille Willis at Tylersville Shops

SITUATION OF PROPERTY

The subject parcel is comprised 6.179 acres and is currently zoned B-1 Neighborhood Business District. The subject property is located west of the State Route 4 By-pass, north of Tylersville Road, and east of Gateway Avenue. The parcel contains a shopping center and associated parking. The applicant is interested in units C-G of the shopping center. Properties to the south and west are also zoned B-1. Properties to the north, east are zoned R-4 Multiple Family Residence District and include Tylers Creek Townhomes and Jessies Landing.

DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST

The applicant is requesting a Similar Use Determination based on section 620.1(f) of the

Fairfield Township Zoning Resolution. The applicant is interested in operating a banquet facility that would be available for lease by private parties and events.

620.1(f) Any other local convenience retail and/or service establishment which is determined by the Board of Trustees to be the same general character as the above permitted uses;

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Fairfield Township Zoning Resolution currently does not have "Banquet Facility" included in the Resolution. Some similar uses that are included in the Zoning Resolution are *conference centers*, *lodges*, *and clubs*. As described in the Zoning Resolution these uses refer to meeting places for private clubs and do not include "any use that is customarily conducted as a gainful business."

The applicant is interested in operating a banquet facility that would be leased out for baby showers, bridal showers, weddings, receptions, and other social events for adults and children. The applicant has made the case that the proposed use is of the same general character to restaurants, bars, and daycares.

As defined in the Fairfield Township Zoning Resolution:

RESTAURANT, means a place where prepared food and beverages are served for consumption on the premises either by providing seating for inside or outside consumption or providing parking spaces for outside consumption.

CHILD DAY-CARE, means administering to the needs of infants, toddlers, pre-school children, and school children outside of school hours by persons other than their parents or guardians, custodians, or relatives by blood, marriage, or adoption for any part of the twenty-four-hour day in a place or residence other than the child's own home.

As defined in the Liberty Township Zoning Resolution

Banquet Facility - A facility or building available for lease by private parties that may include kitchen facilities for the preparation or catering of food, the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption during scheduled events not open to the public, and/or outdoor gardens, decks, or reception facilities.

The shopping center has a total of 200 parking spaces (including 12 handicap accessible spaces) that are shared by all to businesses in the center. The proposed facility is approximately 100 feet from the nearest residential unit located in Tylers Creek and approximately 450 ft from the nearest residential unit in Jessies Landing.

RELEVANT SECTIONS OF THE FAIRFIELD TOWNSHIP ZONING

RESOLUTION

620. B-1 NEIGHBORHOOD BUSINESS DISTRICT PURPOSE. The intent of the B-1 Business District is to receive certain land areas for convenience, commercial, personal services and certain types of business and professional uses.

620.1 PRINCIPAL PERMITTED USES.

- (a) Any retail and/or service uses including but not limited to: grocery or other food stores, drugstores, barber shops, garden stores, beauty salons, bakery shops, dry cleaning and laundry pick-up stations, Laundromats, professional offices and the like, supplying commodities or performing services primarily for the residents of the neighborhood in which they are located.
- (b) Restaurants, not including drive-in restaurants.
- (c) Automobile service stations, garages
- (d) Financial institutions, including drive-in facilities.
- (e) Nursery School and day care facilities.
- (f) Any other local convenience retail and/or service establishment which is determined by the Board of Trustees to be the same general character as the above permitted uses;

620.3 CONDITIONAL USES REQUIRING BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS APPROVAL.

- (a) Residential dwelling units if a part of a principal building.
- (b) Bed and Breakfast.
- (c) Churches and other similar places of worship.

STAFF COMMENTS

Staff has concerns about the proximity to the residential use and the potential noise of the establishment. If the Board of Trustees determines the proposed use should be considered a similar use, the applicant will still need to provide detailed plans for the space and the intended occupant load to be reviewed by the Township Zoning and Fire Departments and the County Building Department for compliance with the relevant codes. Based on the findings of fact, the Fairfield Township Zoning Resolution, and the submitted proposal the Fairfield Township Zoning Department makes the recommendation to **Approve** the proposed similar use determination.

Mr. Barbiere, Law Director Oath given to applicant and sworn in and testified.

Several comments made about noise. Owner to work with us to make sure that doesn't happen. Owner has several plans to reduce noise.

Chief Thomas – This has been an ongoing discussion with the Administrator and ongoing fact-finding within the Fire Department. As you know we are under a deadline to apply for the SAFER Grant this year. It closes the beginning of February. Assistant Fire Chief Schumann has been working on the application for about 6-1/2 months. The grant is ready to go. We are in a severe crisis, not just Fairfield Township but the entire United States fire service. We need to figure out funding in order to keep employees for at least 25 years. The SAFER Grant would offer us a \$3 Million bonus to hire. It pays all the cost!
