REPORT:

- Sergeant Mays attended Week #3 of the Police Executive Leadership College (PELC) and graduated on November 5, 2021.
- Fill-a-Cruiser event at Walmart on November 21st. Officers collected 836 pounds of food and other needed items along with \$403.21 cash for the Fairfield Food Pantry.
- All supervisors received training on the new Guardian Tracking program. It is a robust personnel, communication, and task management tool that will allow for better efficiency and tracking.
- Chief Chabali and Captain Lanier attended the annual Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police (OACP) conference in Columbus. This was the first in-person conference in 2½ years with over 300 members in attendance.
- Detectives Edens and Spradling served as guest speakers for students at Lakota West Freshman School for Real World 101 Day. The day consisted of various workshops such as those in a real world conference and our topic was "How to be a Cop."
- 2600-block of Hamilton Cleves Road a resident called in after the house was struck by a bullet. Officers were able to locate where the bullet came from (1/3 mile away) and the person shooting had a backstop, tree line, and a large amount of land but the round still traveled through everything.
- Detectives assigned multiple juvenile sex offense cases for investigation.
- Officers responded to the Butler County Fairgrounds for a large fight and assisted the sheriff deputies who were working the detail. Several agencies responded to assist escorting people off of the property.
- AutoZone for a menacing report where an irate customer reportedly spit on an employee and threatened to fight him. Charges pending at this time.
- Officers responded to the 3400-block of Hamilton Mason Road for a female who overdosed. Following a
 medical evaluation, she was transported to the BC Jail and booked in on her warrants. Her boyfriend also
 had felony drug warrants and was booked into the jail.

- A victim reported that someone stole items from his locker while he was working out. The suspect obtained the victim's car keys and stole his Porsche from the parking lot. The vehicle was recovered several days later within the township.
- A subject stole an enclosed trailer from behind Butler Tech on Hamilton Middletown Road. Detectives
 investigated the case and obtained leads on the suspect. They recovered the stolen trailer on Augsburger
 Road, arrested the suspect, and booked him into the BC Jail.
- 3450 Tylersville Road (Speedway) for a theft of a motor vehicle. The driver stated he left his vehicle running while he went inside the store. He went outside and saw the vehicle going northbound on SR4 Bypass. The vehicle was located and recovered in Liberty Township approximately 10 days later.
- Evening shift responded to Bridgewater Falls for an assault. The suspect punched the victim in the face and then fled the area prior to police arriving. The victim identified the suspect and an assault warrant was issued for the suspect.
- Evening shift responded to Pentecostal Highway of Holiness Church for an active breaking and entering and located a suspect stealing speakers and other electronics from the church. The subject was booked into the BC Jail and charged with breaking and entering, criminal damaging, and criminal tools.
- Lakewood subdivision for a domestic dispute. An intoxicated male was alleged to have brandished a
 firearm and made suicidal statements. After de-escalation, officers removed firearms for safekeeping and
 notified the crisis unit.
- Sgt McCroskey stopped a vehicle on SR4 near SR4 Bypass. Upon subsequent investigation, McCroskey learned there was a load 9mm handgun in the center console and the driver did not have a CCW permit. The subject was arrested and booked into the BC Jail on multiple charges including the felony.
- Officers responded to the area of Tylersville Road near Morning Dove for an injury crash. Upon arrival the officers learned the driver was deceased. The crash occurred in Hamilton and they handled the incident.
- Arrest warrant issued for a male for Menacing by Stalking (F4) after the suspect followed his ex-girlfriend to work over the past couple of months. That charge remains pending in Area II Court.
