- Fifth Third Bank, 3131 Princeton Road, for a robbery in progress. A black male entered the bank with a handwritten note and then fled the scene with an undisclosed amount of money. Thank you to the K9 units from Trenton PD and BCSO who assisted at the scene.
- 3800-block of Hamilton-Mason Road for a robbery. Victim stated an unknown black male pistol-whipped and robbed him while at a family member's home.
- 2000-block of Parkamo Avenue for a robbery. The caller stated the suspect entered the residence, assaulted him, and brandished a firearm and stole items before fleeing on foot.
- Speedway, 3450 Tylersville Road, for an armed robbery. A black male entered the store, brandished a handgun, and demanded money before fleeing the scene.
- 3000-block of Canal Road. Officers arrested a male subject who had a felony warrant out of Dearborn County, IN with a nationwide pickup radius. The arrestee was booked into BC Jail on the holder.
- Female arrested after she left her 2 and 4-year-old children home alone and one of them was found wandering a block away with no shoes or socks on during the snow and freezing temperatures.
- Structure fire in the 5200-block of River Ridge Drive. One resident pronounced deceased at the scene and another resident was transported for medical treatment.
- Male subject plead guilty for his role in discharging a firearm into a habitation in the Tyler's Creek Apartments in March 2021. He was sentenced to four years in prison.
- Five old cruisers were sold at auction and generated over \$24,000.
- Midnight shift coordinated a clothing and items drive for FCSD students in need. There were approximately 14 large boxes of items filled and turned over to the school district for dissemination.
