- Spec. Darrell Prewitt served as a guest speaker with a group at Redeemer Church and discussed frauds, scams, and how to prevent becoming a victim.
- Officer Singleton and Officer Roach attended a Field Training Officer (FTO) certification course at Scarlett Oaks. Both officers will be contributing to the police department's field training program.
- Capt. Lanier attended the Public Information Officer (PIO) Academy hosted by Communications Counsel.
- (6) sex offenses reported and assigned for investigation – four of those involve juvenile victims.
- Shuler Avenue for an arson investigation where two cars were set on fire while parked in close proximity to an occupied house.
- 2900-block of Hamilton Mason Road for an overdose. The female subject was given Narcan and once alert, officers learned she had a felony warrant for theft of a motor vehicle. She was booked into the BC Jail.
- Crash on Walmart property – caller stated a male subject stole her vehicle while she was in it and abducted her from Hamilton. The subject fled on foot after crashing the car and was identified. Warrants issued for multiple offenses.
- A stolen trailer was recovered at a house in Montgomery County. While detectives were on the scene, they discovered several other stolen trailers from other jurisdictions and notified those agencies.
- Marc R. Rycek was sentenced to multiple years in prison for several robberies including the Speedway robbery on Tylersville Road in 2021.
- A male subject plead guilty to ten counts of Pandering Sexually-Oriented Material involving a minor. Those charges are felonies of the fourth degree and the subject is scheduled for sentencing in April.
- A subject was indicted by a grand jury for two counts of grand theft (F4) after he scammed money from victims using a construction scheme.
