- Officers completed in-service police driving training with the Butler County Sheriff’s Office.
- Female driver attempted to elude officers and drove recklessly before pulling into her driveway and running into her house. Officers were able to get her to come out and they arrested her for outstanding felony and misdemeanor warrants, failure to comply with signal of a police officer, endangering children, and traffic violations. She was booked into BC Jail.
- Burglary on Exeter Street - a male subject broke into the house and officers were able to take him into custody. The subject was acting erratically and admitted to using methamphetamine. He was booked into BC Jail for the felony burglary charge.
- A male subject attempted to rob Verizon Wireless. Officers located the male shortly after and arrested and charged him with attempted robbery, inducing panic, and booked him into BC Jail.
- Male subject was driving recklessly, multiple people reported he drove through red lights and was driving at a high rate of speed. The male subject was located at Speedway and had his young child in the car. Officers discovered he was highly intoxicated, had a BrAC of .358, and ultimately arrested him for OVI and Endangering Children and booked him into the BC Jail.
