- The Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction issued the police department its 2023 Certificate of Approval to operate the temporary holding facility following the annual audit and inspections.
- 1500-block of Harvard Street for a breaking and entering where the suspect was still inside a camper located on the property. Officers arrested the female suspect, charged her with a felony, and booked her into the BC Jail.
- Officers were increasingly being dispatched to a house in the 1900-block of Milton Street where the homeowner made threats of self-harm, shooting police officers, suicide by cop, and openly stated he had an AR-15 rifle with a 30-round magazine. These calls continued and considering the threat to officers, the community, and the subject himself, a strategy was implemented following several unsuccessful 72-hour holds at a medical facility (the subject recently experienced an increase in mental health issues along with excessive alcohol consumption). A search warrant was served and officers recovered several realistic air guns which looked like real firearms. The subject was later arrested and charged with aggravated menacing and making false alarms and booked in the BC Jail.
- Officers responded to the area of SR4 for reports of a naked person running up the roadway. Officer located the individual running northbound on SR4 near Jen's Bar and Grill wearing only underwear. The subject was experiencing an altered mental status and said he was robbed. The subject actually stole his daughter's vehicle and abandoned it in the Butler Tech parking lot where he commenced to bang on the doors and windows during their open house event. The subject was transported to an area hospital for a medical evaluation.
- 2700-block of Tylersville Road for a man attacking his family with a fork. The subject was experiencing an altered mental state and officers were able to get him to a medical facility for an evaluation.
- Officers made a traffic stop and upon a search located drug paraphernalia. The passenger was found to have a loaded .22 firearm, drugs, and had multiple prior felony convictions. He was booked into the BC Jail for weapons under disability and others in the vehicle were also charged for other paraphernalia.
