REPORT:

- Submitted the 2022 Continuing Professional Training documentation to the Ohio Attorney General's Office for review. There may be funding available for partial reimbursement for the required 24-hours of training. The AG determines the categories of training and published a list of the required hours/topics.
- The department applied for and was granted an award to purchase body armor as part of the 2021-22 Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program. This funding reimburses 75% of the price of bulletproof vests we purchase, up to \$4,376.87.
- Sergeant Mays attended Week #2 of the Police Executive Leadership College (PELC). He will graduate in November following the third and final week.
- Property Room Custodian Jeff Yaney was recognized for his hard work in cleaning up and organizing the enclosed bay area following construction and prior to the ribbon cutting ceremony.
- Officer Stebbins attended a Q&A session at StoryPoint Senior Living on Gilmore Road. The speaking event was prearranged and provided a fun opportunity to interact with the residents and staff.
- Several officers attended rifle training and transition drills with our instructors at the shooting range.
- The Investigations Section personnel attended *Trauma Informed Investigations* for Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence. The Butler County Prosecutor's Office hosted the training which was provided by a trainer who is a nationally recognized expert on the topic.
- We took part in the fall National Drug Take-Back event on October 23rd and the police department collected approximately 49 pounds of drugs. Thank you to Clerk Laurie Pitsch and Officer Robinson for their work during this.
- We continue to develop the Guardian Tracking program for use. It is a robust personnel, communication, and task management tool that will allow for better efficiency and tracking.
- Captain Lanier participated in the Fairfield Homecoming Parade and attended the football game afterward for Community Appreciation Night.

- Halloween festivities included Treat Street at Bridgewater Falls on October 30th and Trick-or-Treat on October 31st.
- SRO McDaniel and other officers worked with BCSO K-9 handlers in performing a K-9 walk-through/sniff at Butler Tech.
- A male subject was indicted by a Butler County Grand Jury on several counts of Breaking and Entering, Theft, and Vandalism for breaking into businesses and stealing catalytic converters last month along Princeton and Gilmore Roads.
- Detectives assisted a female who was recently emancipated. They were able to coordinate with various social services who assisted placing her with housing and services and also continue to attend high school so she can graduate.
- Detectives were able to locate a missing adult who had both mental and physical health issues. The family was very appreciative of the efforts and were able to reunite with their family member at a hospital in Cincinnati.
- 2500-block of Lenox Avenue for an aggravated robbery report. The victim stated a subject pointed a firearm at him, stole his wallet, and then fled the scene.
- Evening shift officers responded to the 2700-block of Tylersville Road for an aggravated robbery. A male subject wearing a mask entered the business, struck the subjects with the butt of the gun, and stole personal property before stealing a car and fleeing the area.
- An officer conducted a traffic stop on Liberty Fairfield Road and arrested the driver for being under the influence of alcohol (OVI). The driver tested a .305 BAC, almost four times over the legal limit.
- An officer stopped a vehicle for a violation after it left an area on Parkamo Avenue where officers are focusing on directed patrol. The officer located meth in the vehicle and the driver was booked into the BC Jail for possession of drugs along with other charges.
- Officers located and arrested a subject for a felony child support warrant. The subject was booked into the BC Jail and there are charges also pending for possession of drugs.
