MISCELLANEOUS TOPICS OF INTEREST:

- There was a total of **77** arrests and **91** charges.
- Officer Rui Dutra was sworn in as our newest police officer at the February 18, 2020 Trustees Meeting. Dutra has prior experience and is currently assigned to road patrol and training with his field training officer (FTO). We are glad to have him as part of our township team!
- Captain Doug Lanier graduated from the Certified Law Enforcement Executive program (CLEE). CLEE is a 14-month formal leadership program consisting of multiple in-residence sessions and external studying, research, and assignments. Lanier also received the Law Enforcement Foundation award for having completed the entire police executive and leadership training series, a journey he began in 2008.
- Sergeant John VandeRyt attended the annual Police Executive Leadership College Alumni conference.
- Sergeant Jim Souhrada attended the Greater Hamilton Safety Council meeting on February 13, 2020 at the BC Engineer's Office. They shared information on upcoming projects pertaining to the township.
- CPAA members continue to be a valuable asset to our agency and the township. They assisted with vacation home checks and driving vehicles to vendors for repairs, allowing us to keep our personnel working.
- Two of the three cruisers purchased in 2019 will be ready to go in-service upon installation of the laptop computers.
- Subject crashed his car into the concrete median barrier on eastbound SR129. Officers found the driver unconscious behind the wheel of the running car and had to break out a window to gain access to the driver. The fire department had to extricate him with tools due to the position of the vehicle against the barrier. The driver became alert once given Narcan and officers subsequently charged him with OVI.
- Officers responded to an address on Audubon Drive for a male subject trying to get into a house. Officers arrested the subject on multiple charges including a felony.
- Male subject charged with theft of a motor vehicle that occurred on Cypress Hill Lane.
- Midnight shift stopped a car on Lenox Avenue//Tuley Road. The driver was driving under suspension and further investigation uncovered a crystal-like substance determined to be meth. Officers arrested the subject for the felony drug possession too.
- Female found unconscious and overdosing in the backseat of a vehicle on Indian Meadows Drive//Reigart Road. She was treated at the hospital and later arrested on warrants, felony possession of drugs, and a misdemeanor for drug abuse instruments.

- Officers responded to an address on Baffin Drive for a disturbance in the house. The male was intoxicated, irate, and refused to cooperate with officers. The subject resisted arrest and tried to choke one of the officers, leaving marks around the officer's neck. Officers requested additional units to assist and were able to take the subject into custody and booked him for domestic violence, resisting arrest, obstructing official business, and assault on a police officer.
- Officers responded to a crash on Winter Hill Drive. A vehicle struck a parked car, pushing it up into the front yard. The female driver was arrested for OVI.
- On February 7th, Coco's, located at 3320 Tylersville Road, hosted a live band which came in a tour bus. The area was patrolled closely for issues.
- On February 17th, officers found a running vehicle parked between Jen's Bar and MkJAS. An intoxicated female was found sleeping inside the vehicle and she was arrested for physical control. When officers arrested her, she struck an officer and was also charged with assault on a police officer.
- Officers responded to the 2000-block of Parrish Avenue for an overdose. Officers administered Narcan to the male subject and he was then transported to the hospital for an evaluation.
- Officers responded to a crash on SR128 near Watson's Gravel for a crashed vehicle on its top in the ditch. The driver was transported to the hospital for non-life-threatening injuries and was later cited for the crash and driving with a suspended license.
- A pickup truck, traveling north on Tuley Road, drove off the roadway and struck a brick wall, mailbox, split a telephone pole in half, and then struck a tree. The driver was intoxicated and arrested for OVI.
