MISCELLANOUS TOPICS OF INTEREST:

- There was a total of <u>85</u> arrests and <u>98</u> charges.
- Officer Mitchell and Officer Sensel completed the administrative component of their training since being hired.
 Both officers are now in field training and patrolling with their respective field training officer.
- Officers stopped a vehicle with a Michigan plate which was being driven by a missing 12-year-old juvenile out
 of Michigan. Dispatch issued a BOLO and officers located and stopped the vehicle on SR4 Bypass at Princeton
 Road. Officers took custody of the juvenile who was subsequently released to her parent.
- Officers responded to a crash on SR4 at Rentschler Estate where two dogs were struck and killed by a passing vehicle. Officers helped the dog owners retrieve, transport, and unload the dogs into the owners' garage. They also helped find an organization who would assist them with a proper burial for them. The couple was moving into a new home in Rentschler Estates when dogs got loose and ran into the roadway.
- Officers responded to SR129 for an injury crash. A vehicle was traveling westbound and driving recklessly when the driver lost control, crossed the center median, and traveled into the oncoming lanes and struck a vehicle traveling eastbound. The at-fault vehicle rolled onto its roof and fire department personnel had to free the subject by mechanical means. The driver was transported to the hospital and cited and the driver of the other vehicle did not report any serious injuries.
- Officers located an elderly woman with dementia on Liberty Fairfield at Hamilton Mason Road. The elderly
 woman walked from a residence in Liberty Township and was trying to make her way to a relative's house in
 Ashwood Knolls subdivision. She was safely reunited with her family.
- Officers responded to the 4100-block of Tylersville Road for an unknown person knocking on the back door of a residence. The responding officer was able to locate a female in the 3900-block after dispatch received a second call from another person. Officers identified her and learned she was from Kansas. The subject stated she walked from Cincinnati and appeared to have mental health issues, so she was transported to Fort Hamilton Hospital for an evaluation.
- Officers were dispatched to the 7600-block of Wildbranch Road for a dispute with possible gunshots fired. All the individuals were okay, and a female did fire a gunshot. Officers took the gun into evidence and the prosecutor is reviewing the case.
- The investigations section took a sexual assault report where both the victim and suspect are juveniles. This case remains under investigation.

- Officers responded to Papa John's at 6544 Winford for an intoxicated driver parked in front of the store. Officers located the driver and conducted field sobriety tests. After the test, the driver actively resisted arrest and was taken into custody without further incident. Following the subsequent investigation officers booked him into the BC Jail for OVI and resisting arrest.
- Officers located a reported reckless driver on SR4 in front of Butler Tech. When officers stopped the vehicle, the male driver exited the vehicle, started to walk away, and then took off running. Officers were able to apprehend the male subject and discovered he was intoxicated and tested .219 BAC. Officers charged him OVI and obstructing official business.
- Officers and Butler County Deputies responded to the Theodore Avenue for a suicidal subject with a shotgun. When officers arrived, the mother advised her son was inside the house threatening to kill himself and he had a shotgun. The male proceeded to walk outside with his hands up where officers were able to get him in custody and transport him to the hospital for a medical evaluation. Officers collected the shotgun and secured it for safekeeping.
- Officers responded to Mercy Hospital for a domestic violence report that occurred earlier in the day on Echo Springs. Officers met with the victim who sought professional medical attention for the injuries she received in the alleged attack. The victim alleges she was physically/sexually assaulted by her husband. Officers located the alleged offender and arrested him for domestic violence and booked him in the BC Jail.
- Officers responded to the area of Hamilton Mason and 5-Points for a male running east with a knife in his hand. The male was later located at Bethesda Butler and had a non-life threatening stab wound. The subject said he was stabbed by two different people at two different locations. It is unknown at this time if the subject was stabbed by other people or if the wound was self-inflicted.
