Mutual Aid continues to be a cost-effective means for all area fire departments to deal with surges in requests for service. We all try to maintain resources capable of meeting our average needs. However, we all need to have in place a plan to address unexpected requests.

### **Public Relations**

This year as we continue working on a recruiting for the Fire Department and the Fire Corps. The Fire Corps has begun an aggressive social media recruiting campaign. The Fire Corps has continued to provide valuable assistance in our public education programing.

### **Training**

Every day we have training scheduled. These trainings are predetermined by the training division. We have day shift training and night shift training therefore every member receives appropriate training hours throughout the year. This also helps to keep our ISO rating favorable.

The latest training included Annual Protocol Training and Review. Water Rescue at YMCA Pool. Ice Rescue Training was scheduled but Mother Nature didn't cooperate. We substituted training on the equipment. We will reschedule if we end up with ice later this season.

Captain Baumann continues to manage the training schedule to make sure we are providing any needed training.

We are also working diligently with our new hires to complete their training packets (Blue Book). We have continued our efforts to recruit and hire additional staff members. We are working to complete the process for hiring them.

### **Fire Prevention**

- + Members began working on the 2020 inspections.
- + Story Pointe began operations of the independent living (Three Story Front) and we have experienced a few EMS calls so far. They are hoping to open phase two shortly.
- + We have been preparing for the new Fire Inspector position. This position was posted for the full-time members to apply.

### **General Activities**

Each shift the duty crews are required to maintain station and equipment appearance, cleanliness, and readiness. Below is a list of items that are completed daily and weekly.

The Fire Officer I & II training class began in November. This is a part of our effort to get more of our staff ready to become leaders in our department. This class will run one weekend per month until March.

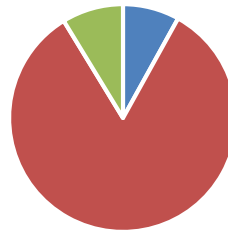

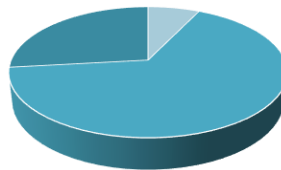

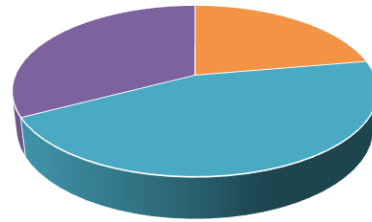

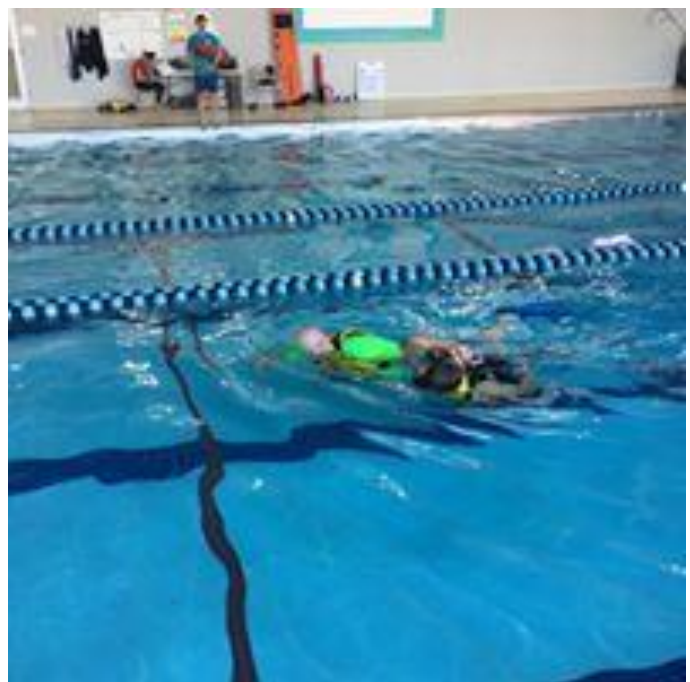

## All Funds



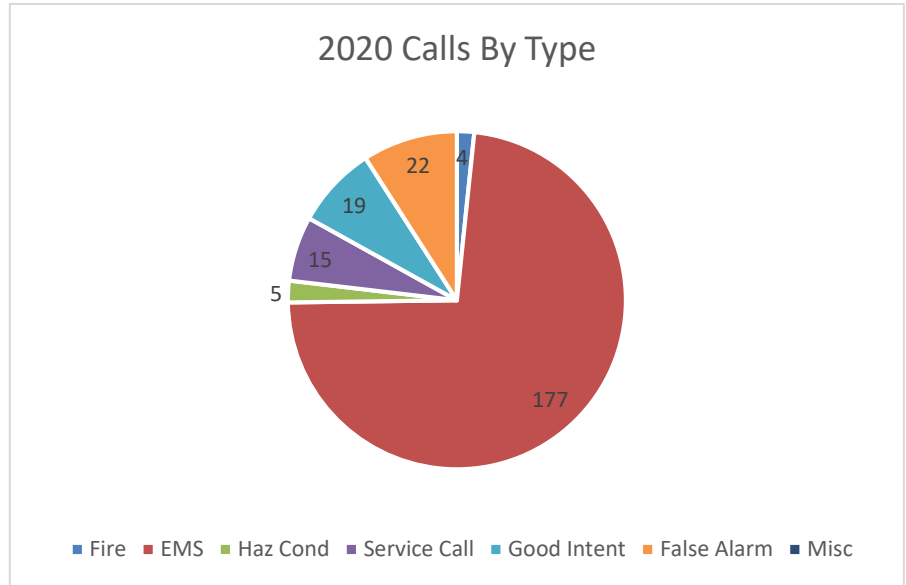

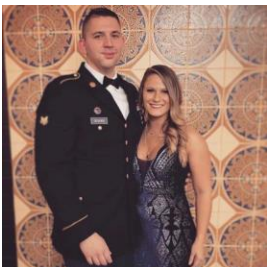
